Transport should be in place, if you have completed the application. Any problems please call the following transport number on 02476 834004.

The LA are still recommending that the safest method of travel assistance is for parents to take their child to school with the offer of a Personal Transport Budget for those eligible for home to school travel assistance.

Please let the school know by emailing admin@tiverton.coventry.sch.uk by Tuesday 1st September if you are going to be transporting your child to and from school, if so please also let transport know so they do not collect your child.

To ensure safety of all pupils and parents on site, if you are dropping and collecting your child the start time will be 9.15am and pick up at 3.15pm. Vehicles are only allowed on site if you have a blue badge or permission beforehand from the Head Teacher. Please ensure you follow government guidelines and wait on the yellow markings when collecting and dropping, do not arrive any earlier than 5 minutes before the start and finish times.

We have put the following in place to ensure the safety of all pupils, staff and visitors:

- The school building has been thoroughly and deeply cleaned and disinfected.
- We will continue to follow all the government guidelines to continue to keep pupils and staff safe from COVID.
- Any pupil or staff with any symptoms will NOT be allowed on site. They will be sent for a COVID test and should remain in isolation until it is proved negative.
- Positive cases will remain at home for the guidance period of 10 days.
- Staff and specialists will continue to use PPE equipment when in close contact with others.
- We have extra cleaning in place throughout the school day.
- Pupils will be kept in key stage bubbles to prevent spread of infection.
- Individual pupils with complex medical conditions, which may make them vulnerable, will have a risk assessment put in place by school, through discussion with parents, school nurse and consultants.

Staff will be in school from Tuesday September 1st, should you have any questions.

I'm sure you'll agree that it's essential that we get our children back into education as soon as possible so that we can continue to build upon their learning.

The initial "recovery curriculum" will focus on Pupils' emotional and mental wellbeing, supporting anxieties and re-establishing routines. Children will have opportunities to talk about their experiences over the last 6 months, re develop friendships, establish secure bonds with their peers and teachers and get back into their Communication, Reading, Writing and maths work.
